**ORDINANCE 2015-01**  
**ALL-TERRAIN AND UTILITY -TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTE ORDINANCE**

The Town Board of the Town of Round Lake do ordain as follows:

1. That the following named roads in the Town of Round Lake shall be designated as all-terrain/ utility- terrain vehicle routes, between those areas posted as such with all-terrain/ utility -terrain vehicle route signs:
  - a. Phipps Fire Lane - from Lenroot Town line to Lenroot Town line.
  - b. Pit Road – from Phipps Fire Lane to State Highway 77.
  - c. Forest Road 320 – from Moose Lake Road to Trail 5.
  - d. Forest Road 319 – from Moose Lake Road to Hunter Town Line.
  - e. Forest Road 174 – Winter Town Line.
  - f. Moose Lake Road (FR164) – from FR 319 to FR 320.
  - g. Moose Lake Road (FR164) – from County Rd. S east to Ashland County Line.
  - h. Moose Lake Rd. (FR 164) from FR 715 east approximately 2/10 mile to FR 421 trail 5 and 21 crossing.
  - i. County Hwy S from Moose Lake Rd. (east) to Moose Lake Rd. (west).
  - j. Pine Point Road, Louie’s Landing Road, River Road , Lazy Lodge Road, Finn and Feather Road, Wolf Island Road, McGovern Road, Moose Lake Club Road, East End Drive, Whaley Road, Forest Circle Drive, and Chippewa River Road.
2. The speed limit shall be 35 miles per hour while operating on all Town of Round Lake gravel roads and 25 miles per hour while operating on all Town of Round Lake paved roads. All-terrain / Utility-terrain vehicle speed is limited to 10 mph within 150 feet of a dwelling or when riding within 100 feet of a person who is not operating a motorized vehicle.
3. All-terrain/utility-terrain vehicles shall operate on the extreme right side of the roadway and travel with the flow of traffic. If blacktop surface ATV’s should stay on road –not on shoulder.
4. All-terrain/utility-terrain vehicles are to be operated in single file.
5. All-terrain/utility-terrain vehicle operators shall yield the right-of-way to all other vehicular traffic and pedestrians.
6. Headlamps and tail lamps shall be turned on and in working order at all times while operating on the roadway or shoulder.
7. Operators of all-terrain/utility-terrain vehicles violating any of the above conditions would be subject to the underlying violation of illegally operating on the roadway.
8. Operators of all-terrain/utility-terrain vehicles travel at their own risk and the Town of Round Lake will not be liable for any damages or injuries to all-terrain/utility-terrain vehicles occurring in the Town of Round Lake.
9. The Town of Round Lake Board of Supervisors may close any route on a temporary or permanent basis as deemed necessary.
10. The Sawyer County Sheriff’s Department is hereby designated as the law enforcement agency responsible for enforcing the provisions of this ordinance.
11. The penalty for violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance is the same as listed in s. 23.33, Wis. Stats., as adopted by reference.
12. This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication as provided by law and shall repeal and replace all all-terrain vehicle route ordinances heretofore enacted by the Town of Round Lake.
