TODAY'S PRIMARY IS A <u>PARTISAN</u> PRIMARY

At a partisan primary, you may only vote for candidates in **one** political party. This has been the case since the early 1900s.

Therefore, when you vote today:

Choose ONE political party in which you will vote, and vote for individual candidates within that party

WARNING: Voting in more than one political party may void your voting choices.
